Peddler, Solicitor, and Transient Merchant Permit \$100/applicant

Please read below, as procedures and requirements have changed for 2024

All Peddler, Solicitor, and Transient Merchant permits

are valid from the date of issuance through December 31 of the current calendar year only.

To apply:

- 1. Application shall be made at least ten (10) regular business days before the applicant desires to begin conducting business operations within the city.
- 2. Applications must be signed by and submitted in person by the applicant. A valid photo ID is required.
- 3. Bring your completed application and full payment to City Hall, 430 Third Street, Farmington, Minnesota. Applications will only be accepted Monday through Friday, excluding holidays, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. **Applications will not be accepted without payment in full (check or cash only).**
- 4. Large groups (four or more applicants) require an appointment with the City Clerk. Contact City Clerk Shirley Buecksler at 651-280-6803 to schedule.
- 5. After a background check has been run and the permit has been approved, the applicant will be contacted via phone or email from information provided on the application.

License types:

Solicitor – going door-to-door taking orders.

Peddler – going door-to-door carrying merchandise with them.

Transient Merchant – selling from a fixed location (i.e., selling corn from a pickup truck in a parking lot)

On December 4, 2023, the Farmington City Council passed Ordinance 023-778 Amending Chapter 18 of the Farmington City Code Regarding Peddlers, Solicitors, and Transient Merchants. The following important information is included in Ordinance 023-778:

3-18-2: Exception. The terms peddler, solicitor, and transient merchant shall not apply to:

- 1. Any person engaging in non-commercial door-to-door advocacy.
- 2. Any person going from house-to-house, door-to-door, business-to-business, street-to-street, or any other type of place-to-place movement for the primary purpose of exercising that person's state or federal constitutional rights (i.e., freedom of speech, freedom of the press, freedom of religion). This exemption will not apply if the person's exercise of constitutional rights is merely incidental to what would properly be considered a commercial activity.
- 3. Any person selling or attempting to sell at wholesale any goods, wares, products, merchandise, or other personal property to a retail seller of the items being sold by the wholesaler.
- 4. Any person who makes initial contacts with other people for the purpose of establishing or trying to establish a regular customer delivery route for the delivery of perishable food and dairy products, such as baked goods or milk.

- 5. Any person making deliveries of perishable food and dairy products to the customers on his or her established delivery route.
- 6. Any person making deliveries of newspapers, newsletters, or other similar publications on an established customer delivery route, when attempting to establish a regular delivery route, or when publications are delivered to the community at large.
- 7. Any person conducting the type of sale commonly known as garage sales, rummage sales, or estate sales.
- 8. Any person participating in an organized multi-person bazaar or flea market.
- 9. Any person selling or attempting to sell, or take or attempt to take orders for, any product grown, produced, cultivated, or raised on any farm.
- 10. Any person conducting an auction as a properly licensed auctioneer.
- 11. Any officer of the court conducting a court-ordered sale.

Exemption from these definitions shall not excuse any person from complying with any other applicable statutory provision or requirement provided by another city ordinance.

- **3-18-5: Prohibited Activities.** No peddler, solicitor, non-commercial door-to-door advocate, or other person engaged in similar activities shall conduct business in any of the following manner:
 - 1. Calling attention to his or her business or the items to be sold by means of blowing any horn or whistle, ringing any bell, crying out, or by any other noise, so as to be unreasonably audible within an enclosed structure.
 - 2. Obstructing the free flow of traffic, either vehicular or pedestrian, on any street, sidewalk, alleyway, or other public right-of-way.
 - 3. Conducting business in a way so as to create a threat to the health, safety, and welfare of any specific individual or the general public.
 - 4. Conducting business outside of the following hours:
 - a. 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday.
 - b. 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday and Sunday.
 - 5. Failing to provide proof of license, registration, or identification when requested.
 - 6. Using the license or registration of another person.
 - 7. Alleging false or misleading statements about the products or services being sold, including untrue statements of endorsement. No peddler, solicitor, or transient merchant shall claim to have the endorsement of the city solely based on the city having issued a license or certificate of registration to that person.
 - 8. Remaining on the property of another when requested to leave by the property owner, their designee, or tenant.
 - 9. Otherwise operating their business in any manner that a reasonable person would find obscene, threatening, intimidating, or abusive.
- **3-18-6: License Transferability.** No license under this chapter shall be transferred to any other person than the person to whom the license was issued.
- **3-18-7: Exclusion by Placard.** Unless specifically invited by the property owner or tenant, no peddler, solicitor, transient merchant, non-commercial door-to-door advocate, or other person engaged in similar activities shall enter onto the property of another for the purpose of conducting business as a peddler, solicitor, transient merchant, non-commercial door-to-door advocate, or similar activity when the property is visibly marked with a sign or placard stating: "No peddlers, solicitors or transient merchants," "peddlers, solicitors, and transient merchants prohibited," or other comparable statement. No person other than the property owner, their designee, or tenant shall remove, deface, or otherwise tamper with any sign or placard under this section.
- **3-18-8: Penalty.** Any individual found in violation of any provision of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and/or subject to an administrative citation, pursuant to city code Title 1, Chapter 4, Penalty.

CITY OF FARMINGTON – DATA PRACTICES ACT NOTICE

Minnesota law requires that you be informed of your rights as they pertain to private information ("private data") collected from you by the City of Farmington ("the City"). Private data is that information held by the City which is available to you, but not to the public.

You have the right to refuse to provide the information requested on this application form, however, without certain information, the City may be unable to approve the license applied for. If you feel that certain information requested is an unwarranted invasion of privacy, please contact the Human Resources Director.

The dissemination and the use of private data we collect is limited to that necessary for the administration and management of the City's licensing program. Persons or agencies with whom this information may be shared include:

- City personnel, including law enforcement personnel, administering the license program;
- The Bureau of Criminal Apprehension;
- The City Attorney and support staff of the City Attorney's office;
- Federal, state, local, and contracted private auditors;
- Federal and State agencies with oversight or responsibility related to the licensed business:
- Those individuals or agencies as to whom you give your express written permission for release of the information.

Unless otherwise authorized by state statute or federal law, other governmental agencies utilizing the reported private data must also treat the information as private.

You may wish to exercise your rights as contained in the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. These rights include:

- The right to see and obtain copies of data maintained about you;
- The right to be told the contents and meaning of the data; and
- The right to contest the accuracy and completeness of the data.
